We hosted a Cake Sale on 29 September in aid of Macmillan and raised £241 for the cause. Thank you to all who donated/bought cakes. Running total for the ink cartridges we collect and send away to be recycled is standing at £60 for this year. Keep bringing them in to the Saturday Shop! We are always in need of jars, approx. 454g size, (preferably not honey jars – the labels are difficult to remove!) to make use of the wrinkled fruit and vegetables we sometimes get left with - they get made into pickles and preserves. The long-awaited refurbishment of the bus shelter area as you will have noticed has not yet happened.......IT WILL! It's just a case of getting the right volunteers together at the right time, the right weather and those people who say they are going to do something to actually do it! At present we are waiting on replacement timber for the shelter. As usual during November and December, a selection of hand made gifts will be on sale at the Saturday Shop. Hats, mittens, throws, stocking fillers, Christmas novelties and more, pop in and take a look. Shop open from 9am to 12 noon every Saturday. It will soon be time to run our Christmas Raffle, as usual only £1 a go, to win a hamper full of goodies. Thinking of Christmas, we shall be open on 24 December as Christmas Day falls on a Sunday this year. Place your orders early!

Quilting Group. Our Sale of Work held on Sunday 22 October was well supported, mainly from those outside the village. We sold ten quilts ranging from full double bed size to a pram quilt, lots of odds and ends, remnants, tea and cake. A quilt is to be donated to Demelza House (Hospice Care for Children) and another will be raffled at the QC in aid of Christ Church Loo Fund. A donation of £500 has been made to the QC, earmarked towards 2024 insurance costs. The group have recently sold a quilt to an ex Kilndown resident, and she has commissioned another. At present a commission from a present Kilndown resident is being worked on, as well as several other projects large and small. There's room around the table for a few more stitchers, pop in on a Tuesday between 10am and noon and have a look at what we do!

If anyone has unwanted balls of wool, any thickness, these will be put to good use. Drop into the QC.

The AGM is on Thursday 2 November, we really do need some fresh faces on the Committee, especially to help out behind the scenes on Show days. Next evening meeting is on Thursday 7 December, a Look at Life at Covent Garden Market and Beyond in the 1950's/60s. Dates for the Spring and Autumn Shows in 2024 are 30 March and 28 September. The schedule is in the process of being rewritten and slightly updated.

It is after 1860, given the position of the organ. The painted decorations and texts on the walls are clear to see. On close inspection, vases of flowers can be seen on top of the screen, there is a wreath suspended over the doors to the chancel, and clusters of what look like laurel leaves are hanging from the candlesticks. There is no clue as to what occasion the floral decorations were for and how were those vases were attached on the screen?
